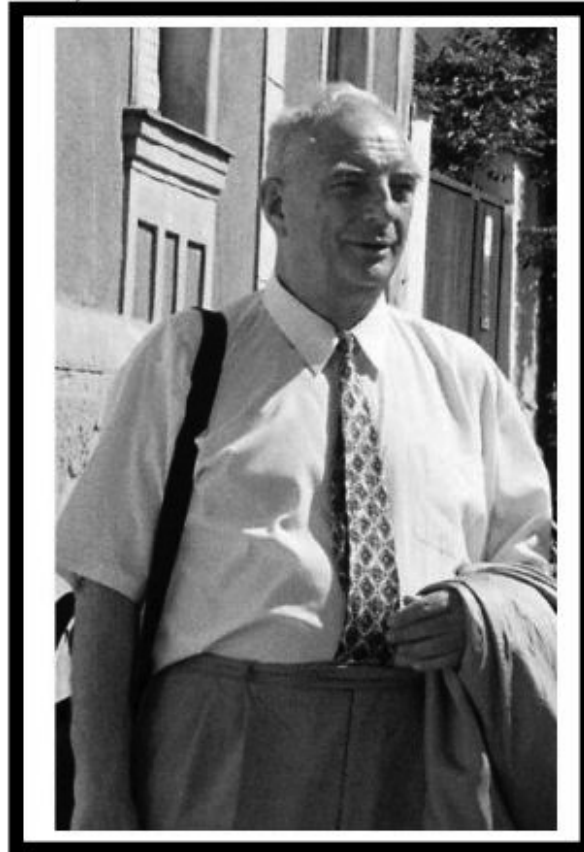


IN MEMORIAM DR. PAL JEDLOVSZKY



It is with deep sorrow that we announce the passing of Jedlovsky Pal, Ph.D, beloved teacher of our Institution, on 10/16/2010.

We all remember him as a bright, funny and friendly colleague. His wisdom and sense of humor made him be very well liked by his students as well.

He was born in 1938, but with his endless energy and vitality, always appeared younger than his age.

He graduated from the *Veszprém University of Chemical Engineering* in 1961 as a chemical engineer and spent more than 30 years teaching in higher education. Before arriving to the Gábor Dénes College, he taught for several decades at the Faculty of Chemical Engineering at the Technical University in Budapest and spent several semesters as a visiting professor in the USA and in South Korea.

He was famous for his brilliant arguments and meticulous course preparations in general and during his Mathematics and Simula '67 courses. In the 1970-s, besides his courses and research, he taught mathematics for blue collar workers seeking higher education. Many of them succeeded and later graduated from the Technical University in Budapest.

He was very active in the scientific community as well. He was a member of the Board of Trustees of the Hungarian Society of Chemical Scientists until 2003, and section chairman as well as supervisory board member between 2003 and 2008.

He was a member of the EFCA committee of computer-aided *design* from 1986-2000.

He presented his research at numerous international conferences and organized the *International Mathematical Conference for Chemical*

Engineers, which was hosted in Budapest at our campus on Bécsi út, in 2006.

He was the leading professor of the course of *Open Operating Systems (UNIX)* at the Department of Computer Systems and System Softwares at Gábor Dénes College for 12 years. His textbook: "UNIX step-by-step" and his computer based practice tool: "UNIX practice files" had seen many editions.

He was the chairman of the Scientific Student Conference Committee at Gábor Dénes College for 10 years. He worked diligently and enthusiastically in preparing our students for the National Scientific Student Conference. His perse-

verance and great advises helped our students succeed year after year.

He accompanied his students to their presentations, cheered them on and celebrated their success together. He arranged for Scientific Student Conferences abroad and at some of our other Hungarian Gábor Dénes College sites. His last UNIX practices and exams were held after his first operation. While he was aware of his futile struggle against his illness all along, he fought with dignity and never allowed it to influence his clarity of mind.
